



BIOHEALTH

Qiagen, GlaxoSmithKline, Medlummune/ AstraZeneca, Otsuka America, ProMetic BioTherapeutics. World-wide bio leaders are here in Montgomery County (Viva White Oak, currently in development, is expected to be a local game changer). Find a strong workforce talent pool and great job opportunities.

CYBERSECURITY

Cybersecurity is projected to reach an incredible \$202 billion by 2021. Montgomery County is fast becoming a cybersecurity tour de force, perfect for reaching the \$14 billion federal government market and the fast-growing private sector, with the National Cybersecurity Center of Excellence (NCCoE) in our backyard.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

More than 1,200 firms employ 90,000 in IT offices across Montgomery County. Well known BAE Systems has its global headquarters in the United Kingdom and four locations in Montgomery County.

HOSPITALITY

UNIVERSITIES IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY CONTRIBUTE TO TOP WORKFORCE TALENT

Montgomery County is home to campuses of 11 higher education institutions

ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS

- Johns Hopkins Montgomery County Campus offers part-time, evening, master's degree courses in bioinformatics, biotechnology, biotechnology enterprise and entrepreneurship, regulatory science and other areas. The Center for Biotechnology Education takes the pulse of the biotech job market to ensure students get the skills they need to succeed in the biotech industry. Many faculty members are working professionals in biotechnology fields.
- <u>University of Maryland/Universities at Shady Grove (USG)</u> has 80 undergrad and graduate degree programs offered by nine University of Maryland institutions¹⁰ on one convenient campus, including internationally recognized University of Maryland College Park¹¹. USG is constructing a state-of-the-art, \$162 million biomedical sciences building to further cyber, engineering and biomedical sciences education, slated to open in 2019.
- Montgomery College is a top ranked community college, with numerous tracks towards degrees in fields that are in high demand, in Montgomery County and around the country.

Montgomery County is within an hour drive of the main campuses of many top-ranked universities including Georgetown University, George Washington University, American University, Howard University, University of Maryland, College Park, and Johns Hopkins University.

Montgomery County is a national leader in developing progressive policies to enhance quality of life. Our community protects the environment through forest conservation easements, increasing permeable surfaces on building areas, and a density transfer program to help protect our county's agricultural land from over-development.

We enhance urban areas through ensuring quality schools, public spaces, and traffic mitigation strategies exist before implementing new development and redevelopment. Even with important enhancement policies in place, our average weighted tax rates are regionally competitive. For BioHealth facility construction, Montgomery County waives all transportation impact fees⁷ to lighten the financial impact.

INCENTIVES AND RESOURCES TO DO BUSINESS

Montgomery County supports your global enterprise with federal, state and county incentives to help pave the way to your successful venture.

FEDERAL INCENTIVES

EB-5 program: Created by Congress in 1990 to stimulate the U.S. economy through job creation and capital investment by foreign investors.

STATE OF MARYLAND INCENTIVES

Maryland Economic Development Assistance Authority and Fund: A flexible and broad-based program, MEDAAF funds grants, loans and investments to support a variety of economic development initiatives.

<u>Job Creation Tax Credit</u>: New companies with at least 60 employees can receive tax credits of up to \$1k per employee, up to \$1 million per company per year.

<u>Brownfields Revitalization Incentive Program</u>: Companies that revitalize a Brownfield site can receive a real property tax credit of 50 to 70% off the increased site value for 5 years.

Research and Development Tax Credit: Companies can receive tax credits on up to 10% of eligible Research and Development expenses.

<u>Biotechnology Investment Incentive Tax Credit</u>: Provides an income tax credit equal to 50% of an eligible investment in a Qualified Maryland Biotechnology Company (QMBC) up to \$250,000 for each QMBC per fiscal year.

<u>Cybersecurity Investment Incentive Tax Credit</u>: Qualified Maryland Cybersecurity Companies can receive a tax credit equal to 33% of an eligible investment; up to \$250,000 for each investor.

STATE OF MARYLAND RESOURCES

<u>MI2 Incubator</u>: Connects Maryland and International companies for successful joint ventures through a targeted array of business services, state-of-the-art facilities, and world-class resources.

TEDCO: An independent organization that is Maryland's lead source for entrepreneurial business assistance and seed funding for the development of startup companies in Maryland's innovation economy.

<u>Dingman Center Angels (UMD)</u>: MD-based angel investment group provides early-stage funding. Invests \$100,000 to \$1,000,000 in seed/early stage companies.

Momentum Fund (UMD): A new, \$25 million early-stage investment fund filling gaps in the funding continuum to propel Maryland Universities' most innovative ideas into the marketplace.

MD Venture Fund: Early-stage, evergreen venture capital fund dedicated to growing businesses in Maryland. Initial funding ranges from \$.5-1.5 million.

MONTGOMERY COUNTY INCENTIVES

<u>Biotechnology Investor Incentive Program</u>: Supplemental grant available to investors in biotechnology companies located in the county. Approved investors that receive Maryland State tax credits will automatically receive the supplemental grant.

Montgomery County MOVE Program: Grants of up to \$8 per square foot of Class A or B office space, or lab space.

Gaithersburg Economic Development Opportunities Fund: Cash assistance for larger companies to relocate or expand within the City of Gaithersburg.

Rockville MOVE Program: Grants of up to \$4 per square foot of Class A or B office space in the City of Rockville. May be used in addition to Montgomery County MOVE.

Montgomery County New Jobs Tax Credits: Companies with more than 25 employees that take at least 5k square feet in a new building can receive 6 years of tax credits.

Cybersecurity Tax Credit Supplement Program: A local supplement to the Maryland Cybersecurity Investment Incentive Tax Credit. Approved investors that receive Maryland State tax credits will automatically receive the supplemental grant.

<u>Green Investor Incentive Program</u>: Offers a supplement to investors in green businesses in Montgomery County.

GRANT AND LOAN PROGRAM

Montgomery County Economic Development Grant and Loan Program (EDF): Financial assistance to established private employers who retain and/or stimulate significant new job creation in Montgomery County.

MONTGOMERY COUNTY RESOURCE

BioHealth Innovation: A private-public partnership serving as an innovation intermediary to advance local technologies, assets and resources; accelerate innovation; and globally connect sectors, industries, communities, and markets.
