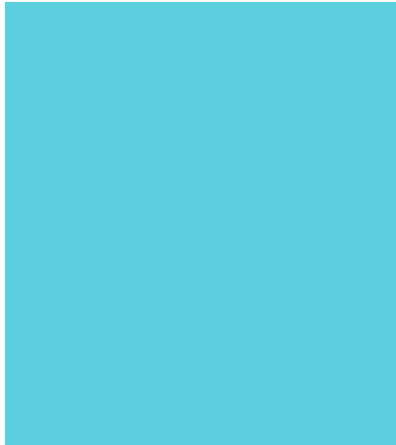

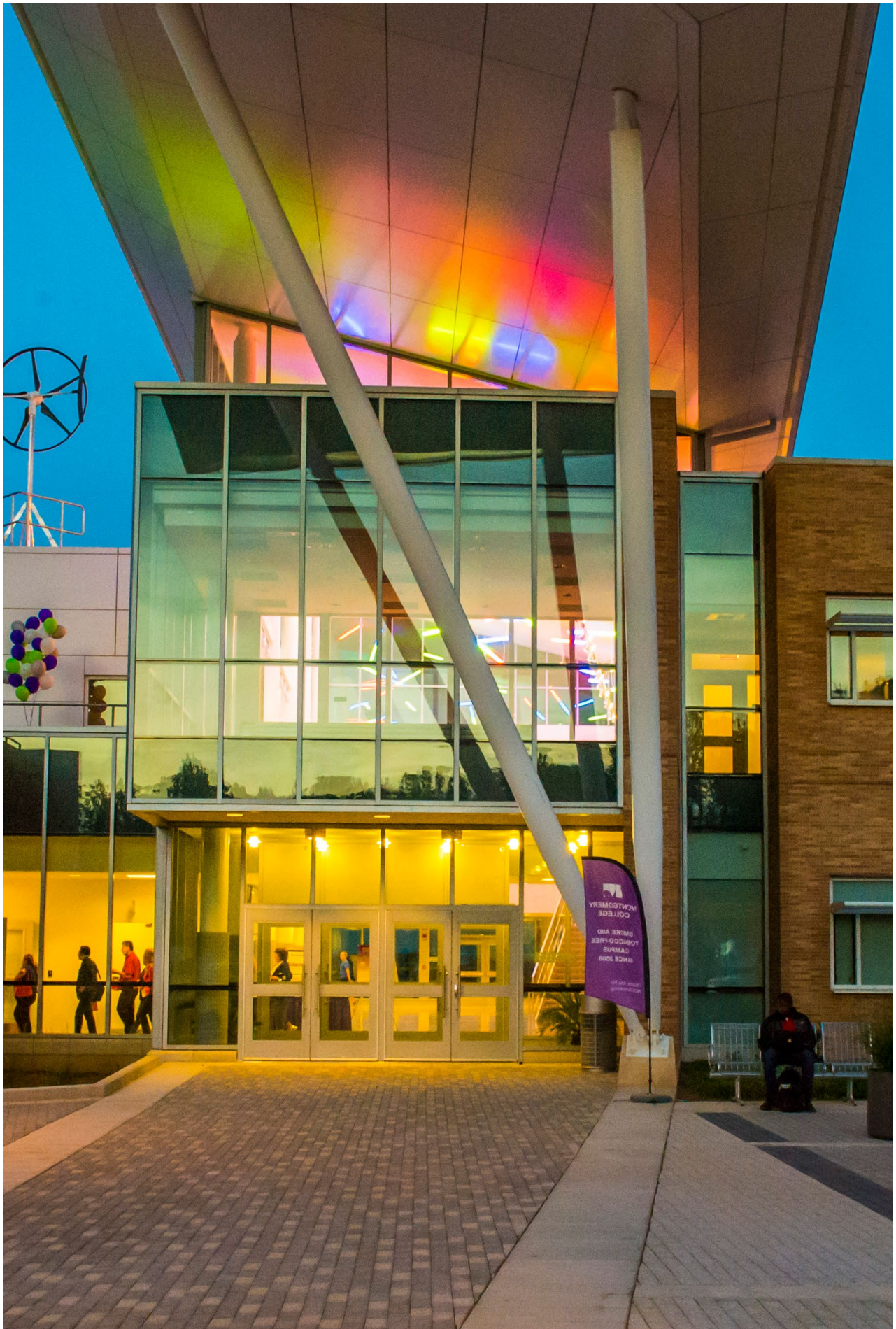

- **Systems Development Fee Exemption:** The local water authority can waive the fee imposed on the sanitary/water fixtures in a new biotechnology or manufacturing project for up to \$50,000/year per project.
- **Life Sciences Center Zone Development Bonus:** The sq. ft. of space in a new project used exclusively for mechanical equipment is excluded from the project's maximum density calculation.

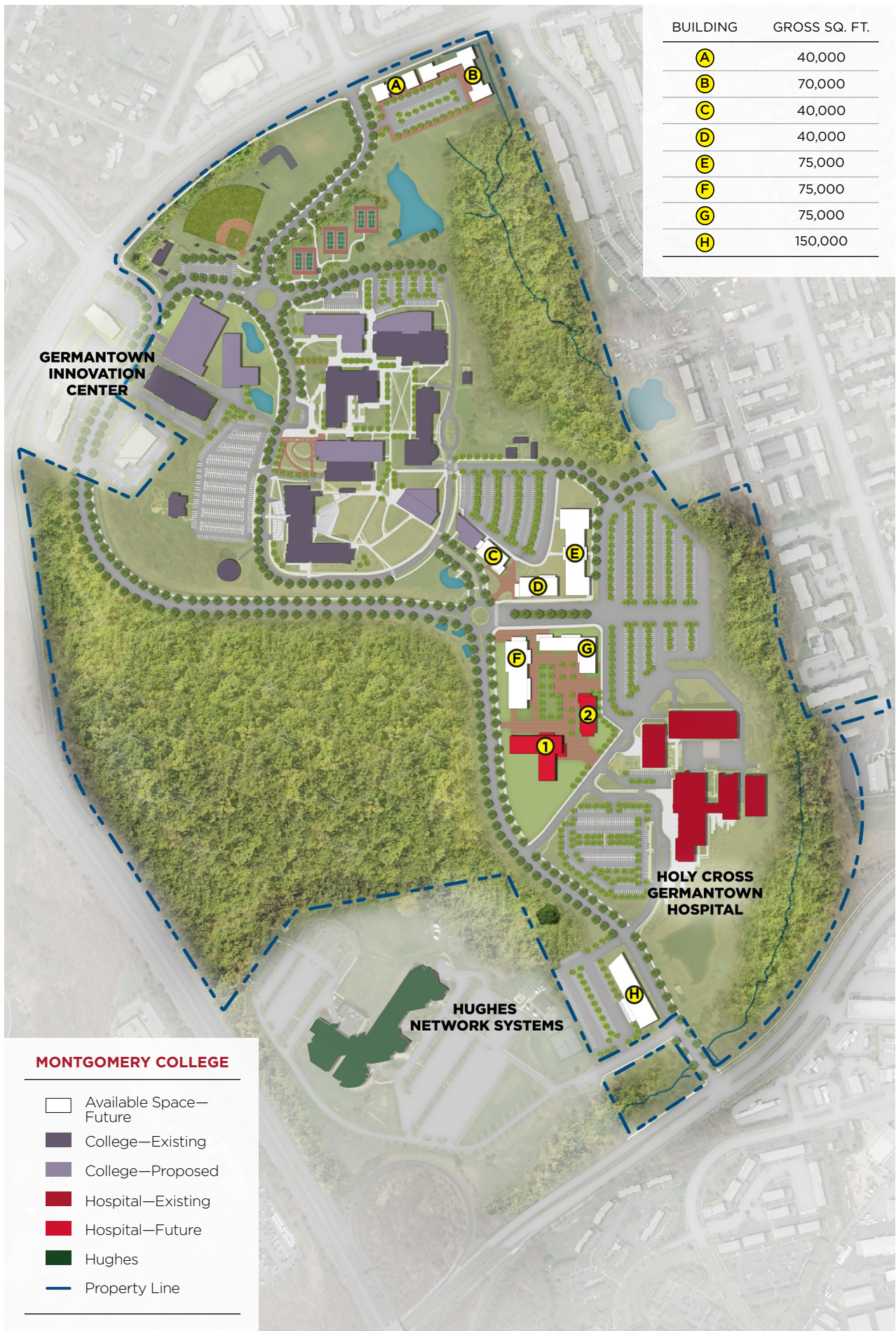

TAX CREDITS AND FUNDING TO FUEL GROWTH

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES PLUS EXCLUSIVE INCENTIVES FOR MD-BASED COMPANIES

Montgomery County and BioHealth Innovation, Inc. (BHI) help make connections to funding opportunities and offer some exclusive incentives to Maryland-based companies.

FIRST COUNTY IN THE COUNTRY WITH A BIOHEALTH INCENTIVE

Maryland Biotechnology Investment Incentive Tax Credit (BIITC): Provides an income tax credit equal to 50% of an eligible investment in a Qualified Maryland Biotechnology Company (QMBC) up to \$250,000 for each QMBC per fiscal year.

Montgomery County Biotechnology Investor Incentive Program: Supplemental grant available to investors in biotechnology companies located in the county. Approved investors that receive Maryland State tax credits will automatically receive the supplemental grant.

PRE-PROOF OF CONCEPT GRANT OR FUND

MD Stem Cell Research Fund: Discovery Program funds new ideas in the stem cell field for basic and translational research. May request up to \$345,000 for up to 2 yrs.

TRANSLATIONAL RESEARCH/PROOF OF CONCEPT

MD Stem Cell Research Fund (MSCRF)-Validation Program: For promising stem cell technologies with significant commercial potential from Universities and research labs. May request up to \$230,000 for up to 18 months.

TEDCO Technology Validation Program (2 Phases): Market Assessment-up to \$10,000 for a market analysis for a technology commercialization plan. Technical Validation-up to \$40,000 for proof-of-principle studies.

TEDCO MD Innovation Initiative (MII)-Technology Assessment Phase: For commercialization of technologies from MD universities. Awards up to \$265,000.

PROOF OF COMMERCIAL RELEVANCE/PRE-SEED

MD Industrial Partnerships (UMD): Matching funds to help MD companies pay for the university research to help commercialize a technology/product.

MD Stem Cell Research Fund-Commercialization Program: For creation of start-ups from new technologies developed in universities. May request up to \$300,000 for up to a 12-month project.

TEDCO MD Innovation Initiative-Company Formation Phase: For corporate product development to prepare for a product launch or to advance a product technology to achieve a commercial milestone.

GRANT AND LOAN PROGRAM

Montgomery County Economic Development Grant and Loan Program (EDF): Financial assistance to established private employers who retain and/or stimulate significant new job creation in Montgomery County

EARLY AND LATER STAGE

MD Venture Fund: Early-stage, evergreen venture capital fund dedicated to growing businesses in Maryland. Initial funding ranges from \$.5-1.5 million.

SEED/START-UP

Dingman Center Angels (UMD): MD-based angel investment group provides early-stage funding. Invests \$100,000 to \$1,000,000 in seed/early stage companies.

INCENTIVES

TAX CREDITS AND FUNDING TO FUEL GROWTH

MD Momentum Fund (UMD): A new, \$25 million early-stage investment fund filling gaps in the funding continuum to propel Maryland Universities' most innovative ideas into the marketplace.

TEDCO Seed Fund: Supports certain types of Maryland companies to develop and commercialize new technology-based products.

TEDCO Piggy Back Grant: Receive an additional \$25k from Montgomery County if awarded life science seed money from TEDCO. No additional application required!

COMMERCIAL REAL ESTATE INCENTIVES

Montgomery County Move Program: Grants of up to \$8 per square foot of Class A or B office space, or lab space.

TAX CREDITS

Montgomery County New Jobs Tax Credits: New companies with more than 25 employees that take at least 5k square feet can receive 6 years of tax credits.

Maryland Job Creation Tax Credit: New companies with at least 60 employees can receive tax credits of up to \$1k per employee, up to \$1 million per company.

Maryland Brownfields Revitalization Incentive Program: Companies that revitalize a brownfield site can receive a real property tax credit of 50 to 70% off the increased site value for 5 years.

Maryland Research and Development Tax Credit: Companies can receive tax credits on up to 10% of eligible Research and Development expenses.

TAX AND FEE EXCEPTIONS

Development Impact Tax Exemption: Life sciences companies constructing new facilities are exempt from the County's development tax; this exemption can be worth millions in savings, depending on square footage.

Systems Development Fee Exemption: The local water authority can waive the fee imposed on the sanitary/water fixtures in a new biotechnology or manufacturing project for up to \$50,000/year per project.

Life Sciences Center Zone Development Bonus: In the County's Life Sciences Center zones, the sq. ft. of space in a new project used exclusively for mechanical equipment is excluded from the project's maximum density calculation.

BioTechnology

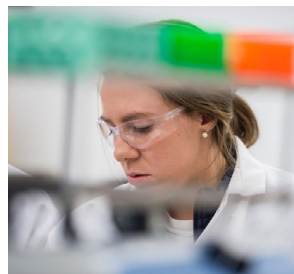
Montgomery College plays a significant role in meeting the **highly skilled workforce needs of the biotechnology and life sciences industries** in Montgomery County and throughout the state, within industries that are dynamic, in constant motion, and key to the region's economic growth.

Healthcare

In 2014, Montgomery College became the **first community college in the country to house an on-site hospital** when Holy Cross Germantown Hospital opened on the college's Germantown Campus. The hospital, which serves as an anchor on the PIC MC campus, is a valuable resource for aspiring healthcare workers, providing students with hands-on learning, state-of-the-art instructional space and training.

Technology and Cybersecurity

Montgomery College has the expertise, the capacity, and the agility to craft training programs and offer degrees and certification options that **meet the ever-changing skill requirements of technology and cybersecurity companies**, constantly aligning our curricula with industry standards and best practices.

- Montgomery College is the lead institution for a 14-Maryland community college consortium called, Cyber Pathways Across Maryland (CPAM).
- In 2015, Montgomery College was awarded a \$4m Tech Hire grant to provide hi-tech pathways for individuals for whom English is a second language.

EDUCATION PIPELINE FOR WORKFORCE AND TALENT

TOP SCHOOLS STARTING FROM K-12

Montgomery County has one of the very strongest educational pipelines in the country. From K-12 and beyond, some of the top are located right here.

An impressive **36 local schools are National Blue-Ribbon Schools** and the County is home to the **top 6 high schools in our state**.

Montgomery College is a leading community college in the country offering associate degrees and certificate options in sought-after STEM fields, while the Universities at Shady Grove and John Hopkins University offer 4-year degrees.

Montgomery County is within an hour drive of the main campuses of many top-ranked universities including Georgetown University, George Washington University, American University, Howard University, University of Maryland, College Park, and Johns Hopkins University. The talent pool is bubbling over in our area to support life science and technology company growth.

MORE ABOUT MONTGOMERY COLLEGE

Montgomery College is a top ranked community college, with numerous tracks towards associate degrees and certifications that are in high demand, in Montgomery County and around the country.

HIGHLY EFFECTIVE, SKILLED FACULTY

To provide training for business and government, Montgomery College's Information Technology Institute draws on 75 Information Technology Institute faculty, hand-selected industry professionals, content experts who are also excellent instructors. Our Hadoop instructor, for example, is a Cloudera Architect. We engage faculty who can provide up-to-the-minute expertise.

LEADERSHIP AND SOFT SKILLS TRAINING

In the past two years, Montgomery College has trained nearly 2500 employees of local companies and government in soft skills. This includes training in project management (PMP), SHRM

human resources, diversity, presentation and communication, all highly desirable skills for our high-tech world.

FLEXIBLE LOCATION TRAINING CAPACITY

Montgomery College provides tech and cybersecurity training at company sites or our own labs at the Gaithersburg Business Training Center. Our Germantown campus features a cyber lab, usable by students and companies. Additional capacity is available on very short notice.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Montgomery College's Workforce Development and Continuing Education offers affordable and convenient non-credit classes in sought after fields. Students can take classes in areas including business, information technology, health sciences and more.

OTHER ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY

- **Johns Hopkins Montgomery County Campus** offers part-time, evening, master's degree courses in bioinformatics, biotechnology, biotechnology enterprise and entrepreneurship, regulatory science and other areas. The Center for Biotechnology Education takes the pulse of the biotech job market to ensure students get the skills they need to succeed in the biotech industry. Many faculty members are working professionals in biotechnology fields.
- **University of Maryland/Universities at Shady Grove (USG)** has 80 undergrad and graduate degree programs offered by nine University of Maryland institutions on one convenient campus, including internationally recognized University of Maryland College Park. USG is constructing a state-of-the-art, \$162 million biomedical sciences building to further cyber, engineering and biomedical sciences education, slated to open in 2019.

TRAVEL BY AIR TO ANYWHERE

Global business is big business in Montgomery County. We have **three international airports** with direct flights to many international destinations. And since more than 160 foreign-owned companies have North American headquarters in the county, this offers a big strategic advantage.

Also, Montgomery County Airpark in Gaithersburg provides convenient corporate and general aviation, offering a local alternative to regional transportation.

METRO SYSTEM

Washington, D.C.'s Metro system is **one of the best public transit systems in the country**, with 117 miles and 91 rail stops located throughout Maryland, D.C. and Virginia. The mass transit service contributes to a regionally connected area, and Metro buses are also available to add riding options.

With construction already started, **the new Purple Line will link Bethesda, Silver Spring, College Park, and New Carrollton**—with service projected to begin in 2022.

COMMUTER TRAINS

MARC trains provide efficient statewide transportation for commuters coming in and out of Montgomery County, with stops in Gaithersburg, Germantown, Rockville and Silver Spring. **Amtrak also stops in the area**, with a platform in Rockville.

TAKING A DRIVE

Near the I-95 corridor, Montgomery County is **perfectly situated for travel up and down the east coast**. The I-495 Capital Beltway to the south provides access to Washington, D.C. and Northern Virginia, with the ICC connecting the I-270 Tech corridor to I-95 and College Park.

CAPITAL BIKESHARE

Montgomery County is part of the regional Capital Bikeshare system. Pick up a bike for quick and easy rides to home or work at participating Rockville, Silver Spring, Gaithersburg, Takoma Park and Chevy Chase communities.

PEDESTRIAN FRIENDLY

Living in Montgomery County allows many **residents to enjoy walkable streets**, landscaped sidewalks, bikeways, trails, and paths for pedestrian circulation and connections to surrounding communities.

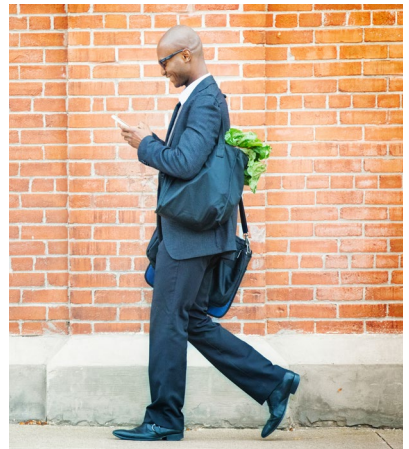
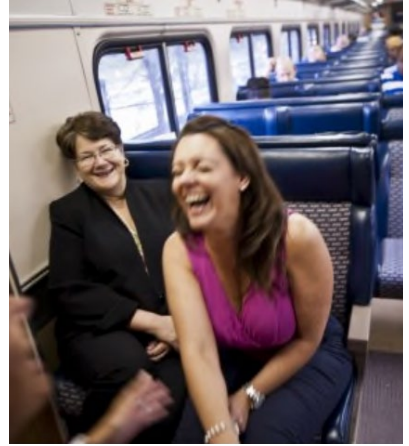
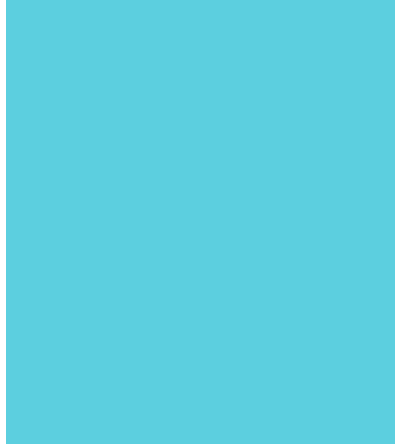

Montgomery County leads the way with a melting pot of cultures, ideas and discoveries. People of all nationalities call this region home. **138 languages are spoken in Montgomery County**, and we celebrate the cultural diversity that flows in our communities. More than 40% of residents speak a language other than English, which is higher than the national average of 21.5%. In 2015, the most common non-English language spoken in the County was Spanish. 14.5% of the County's overall population are native Spanish speakers, while 3.53% speak Chinese and 2.9% speak African languages.

One of our fastest-growing communities is Germantown, in great company with its other Montgomery County neighbors. From our premier office spaces and wet labs, to our research parks and federal institutions, on our farms and in our business incubators, **we're making advances that cross industries and break boundaries.** Our innovation extends to sustainability, where County government operations have been carbon neutral since 2016, delivering a 23% reduction in our carbon footprint.

CREATING A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE

GREENHOUSE GAS REDUCTION

Montgomery County is committed to leading by example in greenhouse gas emission reductions:

- Montgomery County purchases 100% of its electricity supply from clean sources
- County Government has installed more than six megawatts of solar photovoltaic panels on public facilities and **is expected to exceed 11 megawatts by 2018**
- County government operates a total of 243 electric and gasoline/electric hybrid vehicles
- The county's Department of Transportation serves 26 million passengers a year and operates 370 buses, **all either hybrid electric, compressed natural gas, or clean diesel**
- Montgomery County will complete its first two microgrids in 2018, enhanced with a combination of solar energy, and combined heat and power systems that convert electricity into natural gas
- Montgomery County became the first of only a handful of local governments to join the Subnational Global Climate Leadership Coalition, agreeing to pursue emission reductions consistent with a trajectory of 80 to 95 percent below 1990 levels by 2050

SUPPORTING BUSINESSES

Montgomery County prides itself in supporting businesses that help our efforts, which include:

- Green Bank—The first formal green bank organization to be established at a local government level
- Commercial PACE Financing—Commercial property owners can finance energy-saving upgrades

- Fuel Energy Tax Exemption for Onsite Clean Energy—**Electricity generated through onsite solar installation is exempt from the County's Fuel Energy Tax**
- Rainscapes Rewards offers rebates up to \$10,000 for commercial property owners installing rain gardens and other projects
- The Montgomery County Green Business Certification Program is a voluntary recognition effort for businesses that exhibit a high level of sustainability

ENGAGED RESIDENTS

- Bethesda Green, a nonprofit sustainability hub with a mission to promote sustainable living practices

- Over 150 publicly available electric vehicle charging stations—perfect for county residents who used the state's tax credit to purchase or lease a new electric vehicle
- Seven local USDA Organic farms, with their products available through 24 farmers markets and 27 Community Supported Agriculture vendors
- The annual GreenFest, a free, all-day environmental festival helping residents 'green' their lifestyle

FIBER CONNECTIVITY

ultraMontgomery is a high-speed fiber network that connects our business, academic and federal institutions along major corridors and greatly improves communication. The technology-based, multi-year, economic development initiative aims to **grow jobs by making gigabit broadband more affordable** and widely available to public and private institutions in major corridors and transit-oriented communities within the County. In addition to private providers, the County operates its own 570-mile government run fiber network, called FiberNet.

CELLULAR COVERAGE

Montgomery County has extensive 4G coverage from **all four major wireless carriers**—including Verizon, AT&T, Sprint, T-Mobile. Hughes Network Systems, one of the country's two leading satellite broadband providers is also headquartered in Montgomery County.

DATA SYSTEM ECOSYSTEM

Montgomery County offers its own **mature commercial data center ecosystem**. Two of these data centers include Bytegrid and Recovery Point. Bytegrid is a national provider of multi-tenant data centers. The maintainable and fault-tolerant design of this facility offers an ideal location for projects and expansion opportunities for businesses.

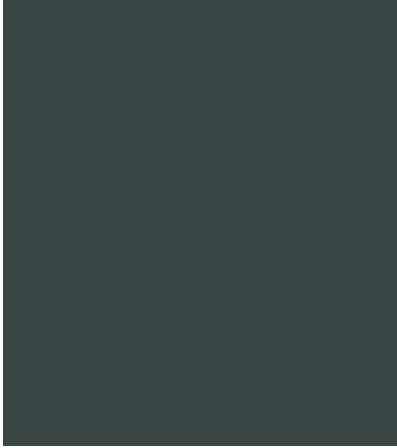
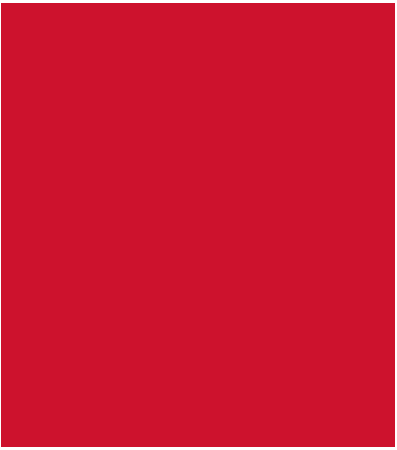

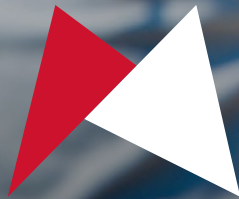
